

## Altice Connects Hispanic Heritage Month Essay Contest Grand Prize Presentation at Robert Frost Middle School with Assemblyman Andrew Raia

Altice USA's Hispanic Heritage Month Essay Contest was launched this Fall across the Optimum and Suddenlink service areas
